# Notes from the Undershepherd's Heart

The Preaching of the Word lies at the very heart of our worship service, but sometimes listening to a sermon can be hard work. But believe it or not, there are things you can do to have a better sermon listening experience.

Here are five things you can do to help get more out of the sermon:

- 1. Pray In Ephesians 6:19, Paul writes, "Pray also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel." The Apostle Paul asks people to pray for his preaching; how much more do I need it? So, pray that whoever is preaching is both clear and bold with the gospel.
- 2. Read The Passage It also helps to read the passage the week before. Psalm 1 says, "Blessed is the man... who meditates on the law of the L-rd both day and night". Reading the passage and meditating on it helps you prepare to hear the word preached.
- 3. Follow Along The Bereans (Acts 17) examined the scriptures to make sure Paul's teachings were true. A good sermon will explain and apply the scriptures. If I am doing my job well, I am getting my main points from the text. Keeping the text open and following along helps you see where the points come from and examine if they are true.
- 4. Take Notes Another great way to make the most out of sermons is taking notes; studies have shown that notetaking helps improve recall and comprehension even if you never look at them again. In the Bible, many kings kept notes so they could go back and remember what had happened (ex. Esther 6:2).
- 5. Discuss it later One last thing you can do is discuss the sermon afterward. Ask people what they got out of the sermon and how they plan to apply it. I provide three discussion questions every week that can be used to facilitate discussion with family and friends, that we may "encourage one another and build one another up" (1 Thess 5:11)

Thomas Chisholm was born in a log cabin in Kentucky. A very bright young man, he became a school teacher in his late teens. At age 27 he came to faith in Jesus. Young Chisholm was an ordinary fellow who loved to read and write poetry. In his 30s his church encouraged him to pursue ministry, and he did. At 36 he became a pastor, and shortly after he came down with some crippling health problems. After only a year in pastoral ministry, he stepped down due to poor health. Medical problems brought more expenses and made work difficult. Within a couple of years, Chisholm found himself in financial trouble... for many people that would have broke them, but Thomas Chisholm looked at it all with hope. Despite all the problems of ordinary life, he saw G-d was faithful. Even though he wasn't a pastor anymore, he had more time to write hymns. Even though he was sick, he had a loving family who cared for him. And he was able to get an ordinary job, selling insurance, to pay the bills. Great is Thy Faithfulness is a reminder that even when life is hard, and things don't always work out the way we might want them to, G-d is always faithful.

## What makes a strong Statement of Faith?

As the council works towards creating a Statement of Faith, it might be helpful for the congregation to know what a Statement of Faith is and what makes a good one. A strong statement of faith accurately reflects key biblical truths, clearly articulates core beliefs, and serves as a guide for the church. It should be concise, biblically sound, and address essential doctrines.



## 1. Accuracy & Biblical Foundation:

- a. A statement of faith should accurately summarize biblical truths, affirming key doctrines without misrepresenting scripture.
- b. It is not meant to be a comprehensive interpretation of every verse, but rather a concise reflection of core beliefs.
- c. Many churches include scripture references to support the statements and help readers understand the concepts.

#### 2. Clarity & Conciseness:

- a. A good statement of faith clearly states what the church believes and who they are.
- b. It should be easy to understand and avoid ambiguity.
- c. They are often organized into sections that cover specific topics, such as God's nature, the authority of scripture, and salvation.

#### 3. Defining Core Beliefs:


- a. A statement of faith identifies the core doctrines that are essential for church unity and peace.
- b. It should outline the boundaries of acceptable belief, preventing the church from falling apart due to disunity.
- c. Examples of core beliefs often include the nature of God, the divinity of Christ, and the means of salvation.

## 4. Purpose & Function:

- a. A statement of faith serves as a guide for the church, clarifying what is believed and expected of its members.
- b. It can also help to protect the church's ministry and message by defining what the church stands for.
- c. It can be used to address critics, clarify teachings, and provide a general understanding of the church's beliefs.
